SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMS AT THE HUBER REGISTRATION OPEN!

The Huber is offering two programs for youth this summer. Younger children (ages 6-12) can attend the KIDZ Day Camp (June 3-12) and will be exposed to many aspects of producing



a show. They have experiences with props, set pieces, music, art, dance and get experience as an actor on stage. Workshops will be held 9:30 am - 2:00 pm. Participants will bring their own lunches and stay at the

YEAR IN REVIEW 2024

The Huber has a very successful year with over 50 events being hosted. These included 6 Huber productions, 2 school productions, 4 other entertainment presentations, 12 concerts, 3 school events, 2 parties, 2 tours, 5 meetings, and a wedding reception. We hosted musicals, plays, and dinner theaters, as well as a variety of concerts that ranged from nostalgic 50's to rock and Christian music including local talent presentations from the school and on the patio. Many community members took advantage of our auditorium and community room for a wedding reception, meetings, and parties to celebrate birthdays, graduation, baby and wedding showers.

The Huber Board of Directors want to thank everyone who supported the Huber in the past year. A huge thank you to the volunteers who work concessions, participate in productions, plan events, and complete all those extra jobs like decorating for the holidays and keeping the costume room in order. The Huber would not be able to continue without the generous support of our Patrons of the Arts and other donors, but mostly, the loyalty of those who attend the events and shows at the Huber.

BUILDING UPDATES

The Board of Directors is always looking forward and hoping to maintain and improve the facility for future generations. During the past year, the Huber has completed updates in the balcony, including designating the balcony as reserved seating. This allows for patrons to reserve balcony seats during the pre-sale of tickets for Huber shows. In addition, storage compartments were constructed to house set pieces and set building materials. A major upgrade to the exterior of the building was completed with the replacement of the exterior doors and windows on the front of the building and the doors to the patio. Additionally, the original brick wall at the back of the stage was repaired and sealed to retain the character and authenticity of the facility. And most recently, the stage curtains were professionally cleaned.

The capital improvement and maintenance budgets are determined each year from the profits accrued through contributions, productions, fund raising events, rental fees, concession sales, and donations. The Huber Strategic Plan is reviewed annually to prioritize maintenance and improvements that are needed to keep the building in good repair and address "the wish list" of upgrades as funding becomes available.
