

SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMS AT THE HUBER REGISTRATION OPEN!

Once again, the Huber is offering two programs for youth this summer. Younger children (ages 6-12) can attend the KIDZ Day

Camp (June 3-12) and will be exposed to many aspects of producing a show. They have experiences with learning stage terminology, creating and using props, helping design set pieces, music instruction, art activities,



age appropriate dance instruction and get experience as an actor on stage. The well-rounded theater experience culminates with their performance of Candy Kingdom June 12 at 7 pm.

The Huber Summer Youth Junior Theater Academy serves kids ages 13-20. Their performances of Bye Bye Birdie are scheduled for July 19 & 20. During their academy days (June 17- July 18) they will be actively involved in rehearsals learning how to act, sing and dance or perfecting existing skills. Certified music instructors will guide them through all the music. Age appropriate dance skills will also be included in the curriculum. Participants will be involved in many aspects of stage productions including blocking, costuming,



set/props construction, backstage crew, and character development. Our participants totally absorb the theater life that will be useful in their future endeavors on stage. The added bonus is the great friendships that are formed during these camps that will last a lifetime.

Part of the Huber Mission Statement is to involve the community and provide learning experiences. Therefore, we have kept our prices for our youth programming relatively low to better serve the area youth and their families. Cost for the KIDZ two-week camp is \$100. THE DROWSY CHAPERONE

The Huber Opera Lane Performers are producing a hilarious musical, The Drowsy Chaperone, at the Huber Opera House in Hicksville, Ohio, with show dates of March 28, 29 & 30. On Friday and Saturday nights the option of a Dinner

Mix in two lovers (Jordan Hammersmith, Summer Schooley) on the eve of their wedding, a bumbling best man (Ryan Hunt, Jr.), a desperate theatre producer (Dan Lehman), a not-so-bright hostess (Kathy Kennedy), a butler (Hal Osmun), two gangsters (James Greer, Jake Evans) posing as pastry chefs, a misguided Don Juan (AJ Lorenzini), an intoxicated chaperone (Stephanie Longbrake), a hopeful starlet (Katie Frame), and an aviatrix (Brooke Schooley) and you have the ingredients for an evening of madcap delight.

Winner of five Tony Awards, including Best Book and Best Original Score, The Drowsy Chaperone is a loving send-up of the Golden Age musical, featuring one show-stopping song and dance number after another by the Ensemble (including Sydney Fogt, Leah Garmater, Joey Greer, Nichole Robinson, Leah Thomas, and Jordys Vance). Hailed by New York Magazine as "The Perfect Broadway Musical," The Drowsy Chaperone is a masterful meta-musical, poking fun at all the tropes that characterize the musical theatre genre. Living History Concert

Friday, June 6 at 7:00 pm- Sesquicentennial Weekend Hart's Boys & Girls Band Concert presented by American Musical Productions



Celebrate Hicksville's Sesquicentennial with an authentic "living history" concert recreating Hart's Boys and Girls Bands. In 1907, Hicksville jeweler and musician O.V. Hart formed and trained a band of local boys. The band gained local and national notoriety performing at the Huber Opera House, as well as touring throughout the state. When World War One called for the local boys, Professor Hart formed one of the first all-girl concert bands. Hart's Girls Band took toured the country in the 1920s, but always returned to its home base of Hicksville with annual concerts at the Huber.

This exciting concert will pay long overdue tribute to both ensembles. The FREE concert will feature musicians attired in period uniforms. Step back in time to hear the same music your great-grandparents enjoyed; from light classics "Poet and Peasant Overture," to musical comedy selections from the original 1902 Broadway extravaganza "The Wizard of Oz" and, of course, marches by John Philip Sousa!
